During our November meeting Ray Janiak shared with us the anniversary of the taking of the Pacific islands of Tarawa. I was a little taken aback, not knowing what to say to his statement. Going all the way back to my childhood I've always read everything I could on WWII. When Ray made his statement I knew full well the magnitude of what Ray was sharing with us. Tarawa is an atoll 2,500 miles southwest of Hawaii. Its importance was the airstrip on the biggest island of Betio. This was one of the bloodiest battles in Marine Corps history. Ray was a Navy Corpsman attached to a Marine unit. Most of you know that the Marines have no medical personnel of their own; they use Navy Corpsmen that are attached to their combat units. Ask any Marine and they'll tell you the extremely high regard in which they hold these medics. The Marines of the 2nd division lost 3,000 men. The Japanese lost 4,700 with only 17 survivors. I believe the battle lasted three days. Those who served in WWII are heroes to me. No generation in the last 200 years has done more to preserve our freedom than they have. I'd like to take this opportunity to thank Ray and all of our WWII Veterans for stepping forward and serving during one of our nation's most trying times. Without your service we wouldn't be the country we are today. Keep warm everyone and I hope to see you Wednesday.
